After holding key positions in sales and marketing for several Fortune 500 companies, President and CEO Arthur J. Lee,

incorporated all the best practices from his intense corporate experiences and combined them with his vision to become an entrepreneur. His first independent endeavor was building a successful printing franchise that generated nearly a million dollars in sales. Mr. Lee sold Alphagraphics and shifted his focus to the hospitality industry.

Additionally, Lee Wesley owns and operates several Burger King Franchises and a Nathan's Famous Restaurant in Jacksonville, Florida. The Company is also a Panda Express licensee at the Orlando International Airport.

Mr. Lee's best practices of establishing higher standards for quality measurement and customer service in the hospitality industry, merited Lee Wesley one of the highest awards in the industry. In 2007, Mr. Lee was one of only ten recipients in North America to receive the Burger King Brand Leadership Award. Mr. Lee gives credit for this distinguished honor, and all of his awards, to his committed management team and dedicated employees.

In 2003, Governor Jeb Bush appointed Mr. Lee Secretary/Treasurer of the Expressway Authority Board. He also served on the Finance, Audit, Operations, and Right-of-Way committees. Mr. Lee served through 2006 and 2007 as Chairman of the Transportation and Expressway Authority Membership of Florida (TEAMFL). He is currently on the Board of Restaurant Services Incorporated, a Burger King cooperative.

Mr. Lee is a proponent of philanthropy and volunteerism. He is a sponsor of the The Orlando Sun Youth Basketball Team. He believes that a successful business should have a partnership with the community, and is currently a member of the Board and immediate past chair of Frontline Outreach.
